SAFETY

E-BILLING Switch to e-billing for a simpler, faster way to manage your account. Ditch the paper clutter. Get your bills notifications delivered directly to your inbox. Pay anytime, anywhere, with the convenience of e-billing. Get instant access to your billing history and payments online.

ENROLL FOR PAD PAYMENTS: Your utility offers Pre-Authorized Debit, where payments are withdrawn automatically from your chequing account on the due date of the bill. Contact your utility to learn more.

MOVING IN OR OUT? Opening and closing accounts requires a minimum of 7 days notification prior to the change. This can be done online or over the phone.

LOW INCOME CUSTOMERS can have their deposit refunded. Please contact your utility for more information on this and on support programs available.

ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION customers who have provided your utility company with an e-mail address have agreed to receive electronic information. If you wish to opt out of this option, please contact your utility.

NEW DISTRIBUTION RATES are proposed to be in effect as of January 1, 2026. Information about rates can be found on your utility website.

YOUR SAFETY/ENVIRONMENT MINUTE

AN IMPORTANT SAFETY MESSAGE

Substations are critical components of the electrical grid. They house a variety of high-voltage equipment, including transformers that reduce transmission line voltage to levels suitable for safe distribution throughout the city. Vandalism and damage to substation equipment, including fences, can create hazards to workers and the public. Immediately report suspicious behaviour near substations and stay clear of the area.

FARM STRAY VOLTAGE is the varying amounts of low-level voltage that exists between the earth and electrically grounded farm equipment. At high levels, the voltages cause a threat to the health and behavior of livestock. If you think Farm Stray Voltage is harming your livestock, please call your local utility for an inspection.




REGULATED PRICE PLAN


